Imagine: You're in pain, you're bleeding, but you cannot leave work.

That is the reality for thousands of workers at garment factories in South and Southeast Asia. Especially in Myanmar, the situation got even worse within the past four years, since the military forcibly took power, (re)installing a dictatorship. Even when the workers are on their period, they have to work overtime, six days a week and without proper sanitary facilities. In addition, the prices for menstrual pads have been rising so high, that most workers cannot afford them anymore. As a result, many of them use left over fabric from the garment factories as pads, which often leads to infections.

Looking at these examples, there is no excuse for other countries not to follow suit!

We demand:

- 1. Free menstrual products at the workplace or the payment of a bonus equal to the cost of these
- 2. Paid leave for workers during their menstruation period!
- 3. Adjustment of workload for pregnant or menstruating workers and dropping of imposed production targets!

Our demands are directed at factory owners all over the world, as well as clothing brands, which profit from the exploitation. They must ensure that the required conditions are met!





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
